#### <u>Highlights</u>

There are so many good news stories to recognise and celebrate, however, I have listed the initiatives below that have had a massive impact on the school's journey for improvement.

### Extra Classroom and Smaller Class Sizes - Seven Classrooms!

This year we have seen the benefits of incorporating a new classroom to offer smaller class sizes. This was geared towards providing a more supportive and individualised learning environment for every student. This initiative has certainly enhanced our explicit teaching, provided tailored individualised learning, and created high-quality spaces that facilitate the development of strong, meaningful relationships. All students from Year 2 up, are in mainstream class structures to enhance the overall educational experience and further support focused, staged specific learning for our students.

### · Learning Support Team

We now have a dedicated Learning Support Team five days a week made up of five staff who are dedicated to ensuring all students have tailored support for their learning, assessment and wellbeing needs throughout their educational journey. The team lead processes ensuring all required services and providers are connected to the school and families.

### Professional Learning to Build Staff Capacity

A Professional Learning team has been established to lead the use of high-impact professional learning principles that all staff address to ensure effective classroom practice and student wellbeing. There is high quality, personalised learning occurring in every classroom across the school.

#### <u>Whole School supporting Positive Behaviour and Learning</u>

The new merit system coupled with the new PBL focus, have strengthened students understanding of the school's values. Students regularly hear, see, and demonstrate Respectful, Responsible and Quality Learner behaviours and like all learning, the more students practice this, the better they become. We are seeing positive choices and behaviours across the school and it is only getting better.

### <u>New Bell Times – starting Term 2</u>

As you would have seen in the previous newsletter, new Bell Times will start in Term 2. As we constantly strive to enhance the efficiency and effectiveness of our school day, we have reviewed several models to better accommodate the needs of our students and the new curriculum requirements. We are excited with the new bell times starting next term as it will most certainly support transition throughout the day and optimise learning time. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we work towards creating an even better learning environment for our students.

#### **Executive Director and Director visit**

We had the pleasure of hosting a visit from our Executive Director and Director of Educational Leadership a couple of weeks ago. The purpose of the visit was to review policies and procedures, talk with staff and students, visit classrooms to observe quality teaching and review the schools progress on our journey to towards excellence. We were so very proud of the overall report showing immense growth and improvement in all areas of the school. Data captured has revealed overwhelming improvement in four domains; Purpose and Direction, Work Environment, Enabling Practices and Leadership. 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### **PBL MERIT SYSTEM CELEBRATION**



Term 1 has seen an amazing start to 2024 at BPS. The classrooms are abuzz with high quality teaching, learning and relationship building. Along with our explicit instruction, feedback and differentiation, we have ensured that all students are catered for and that no one 'falls through the cracks' by providing intensive literacy intervention groups. After carefully analysing the data and consulting with classroom teachers', small groups were established from each class. A large number of staff were trained in the Mini and MacqLit literacy programs and now, four mornings a week, we see a small group of students head to their designated area for this fast paced, interactive and evidenced based intensive intervention. The children are doing well, with strong gains made already. We can not wait to review their progress in the near future.


